Life Returning to Staghorn Lake

I like to walk from my home, across the dam, through the woods to the Staghorn dumpster and back toward home. It is a nice walk when it is not raining.

Recently on my walk as I approached the cement boat ramp on Staghorn Lake, I saw Pam McGee and her two grandkids. Pam told me how much fun it was to see all the tadpoles and minnows now in Staghorn Lake. They are easy to see along the shore line because the water is so clear.

Staghorn Lake is very clear in part because we removed years of accumulated dirty water when the Lake was drained to rebuild the dam spillway. It also helps that our lake maintenance support organization is putting chemicals in the lake when needed to control the growth of weeds.

The clear water is attracting all kinds of wildlife. I have seen in recent days, our Swan, Blue Heron, King Fishers and now a newcomer, a double-breasted Cormorant below.



David McGee says he is seeing this waterfowl on a regular basis. The Cormorant is a large, top heavy and mostly black bird. It has an upright posture, a wingspan of more than 5 feet and large webbed feet. You will know when you see it, because of the size.

Our new neighbor can spend two minutes under water. Its wings are not waterproof so you might see our Cormorant fanning its wings out in trees along the shoreline.
