Staghorn Lake Floods

On January 8^{th} and 9^{th} 2024, Staghorn and surrounding communities experienced high winds of 12-15 mph and over 4.5 inches of rain fell in a short period of time. It caused extensive damage.

Water raced from Staghorn Lake past the tennis courts and straight toward the Staghorn Recreation Center. Water flowed past overturned picnic tables that moved water away from the clubhouse and down a narrow gully adjacent to the building.

The Recreation Center Building had very little water on the cement floor. However, the heavy rain damaged the vertical spillway pipe's ovality and mesh strainer screen used to catch debris.

Fishing Dock Upgrade Completed

In December, our fishing dock was upgraded with new moisture resistant boards by Lighthouse Marine Solutions at a cost of almost \$18,000. The new materials are long lasting and durable. New floats were also added to improve the dock's longevity.
