## Protecting Your Property Helps Us All

As you know there was recently a tragic loss of life of a UGA student in Athens. Crime is here to stay. Nicholson, Georgia is 13.1 miles from the center of Athens, Georgia. The crime rate in Athens is high at 48.72 per 1,000 residents in a year.

Could you be the victim of crime? By protecting your home and personal property you are helping all of us from becoming the victims of crime. There are some things that you can do to protect your individual safety.

- Leave a light turned on using a timer at night to ward off intruders;
- Set up a routine to make sure all doors and windows are locked at night;
- Let your neighbors know when you expect to be out of town;
- Ask neighbors to pick up unexpected deliveries when you are on vacation;
- Keep your garage door closed when it is not in use;
- Hang curtains or install blinds to block the view into your home;
- Report strange vehicles parked near your home;
- Make sure your kids don't overshare your plans on social media.

Please follow the above recommended safety steps to protect us all.

## Eyes on Staghorn Safety Program

At Staghorn it takes residents who care that make us more than just a place to live. These are people that are actively working on your behalf behind the scenes to make our neighborhood a better place to live. One way to care for each other is through the EYES ON STAGHORN program.

I'd like to introduce you to Mark Harrell, one of our Staghorn Community Leaders. For the past year, Mark has led an organization of volunteers that provide an addition layer of protection in our community.

What is Eyes on Staghorn? Eyes on Staghorn is a Neighborhood Watch program that focuses on providing a way for community residents to be vigilant by reporting things they believe need to be addressed on their street.

Who is Involved in the Program? There is a resident on your street that keeps a watch out for you and reports things to Mark Harrell, SPEHOA Security Chair.

What Do They Report? Eyes on Staghorn volunteers recognize potential problems that might make you vulnerable to crime or property damage.

Volunteers can report garage doors being left open on a regular basis which is a security hazard. They may notice no lights on in your home. They will not go onto your property, just observe things from the street.

They also observe things happening around you like street lights that are out, strange cars parked near your property or branches leaning toward your driveway or street.

What Else Does Eyes on Staghorn Do? Mark has an active video camera surveillance program that protects the Staghorn Recreation Area. Violators are reported to the Jackson County Police Department and will be prosecuted.
