Nicholson Community Cleanup Day

Those Staghorn residents that live within the City of Nicholson may drop off items at Dumpsters that will be located at the Benton Center City Hall parking lot. Dumpsters are available on Saturday April 20, 2022 at 8:00 AM. There are only a few Staghorn residents that this applies to and you must show proof of residency. No tires, paint or batteries.

Jackson County Spring Recycling

But wait! There is another alternative. Jackson County Landfill at 100 Landfill Drive, Jefferson is having a "Spring Recycling Day" on April 20, 2024. They are also open from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM. You can drop off cardboard, clean plastic bags (no Ziplocs), aluminum cans and household hazardous waste for free.


Also, drop of 5 gallons of paint free with \$2.00 for each additional gallon. They will even do document shredding for you. There is a limit of two boxes. Extra tires? You can drop of 6 free of charge.

So, once you have dropped off your recyclable items drive into the front gate of the Staghorn Recreation Center on Hwy 335 Brockton Road or enter via Staghorn Trail Extension. Everyone is welcome. Bring the kids.

Staghorn Lake Wildlife Refuge

This is the time of year that birds are migrating north and you are likely to see all kinds of things. Looking out our window this week we saw something amazing it was this big bird sitting on a branch eating something. Susan got out the binoculars and discovered it was an Osprey.



The Osprey we saw on Staghorn Lake was eating a small rodent. This Osprey has a fish.

More Osprey are making their nest in North Georgia where once good nesting sites were lacking. Ospreys prefer a high tree near the water with good visibility on all sides of the nest. Corp of Engineer Park Rangers have erected 6 poles around Lake Altoona for Osprey. The birds also have nests at Lake Lanier.

If you look closely while visiting the lake you can also see all sorts of birds from cranes to kingfishers. There is lots of activity.

This week we have had six little Coots with yellow bills and black bodies diving underwater in Staghorn Lake. Coots feeds mostly on underwater grasses such as redhead grass, sago pondweed and wild celery. They will also eat small fish, insects and invertebrates.
